Surrey School District & Fresh Grade

- Examine system-wide implementation of the e-portfolio, assessment framework and the parent/student engagement and communication tool Fresh Grade
- Examine how district-wide implementation and monitoring proceeded to ensure success and investigate how Surrey District students, teachers, administration and parents have engaged in new and different methods of assessment and communication of student learning

- This opportunity will inform local system level planning and frame local engagement strategies with staff, students and parents/guardians in preparation for opening of a new Catholic elementary school that reflects and models innovative, flexible and community oriented learning environments
- Provides an opportunity to document a range of dimensions related to school organization, community utilization, and flexible planning of shared learning spaces associated with the school design
- Also designed by Fielding Nair, the Norma Rose Pointe school has embraced a student centered approach to curriculum and has been designed around shared community learning spaces, and small and flexible learning communities where teachers co-plan and co-teach regularly. Staff integrates curriculum across various subjects and plans for fluid cross-grade groupings based on need and interest. Innovation and student led inquiry are integral aspects of their teaching and learning philosophy which are components of ALCDSB's Board Improvement Plan for Student Achievement and Well-Being (BIPSAW)

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
